First, we will renew the links with companies in the Action and welcome new companies. Some STSM will be dedicated to the company for students who would have a stay in a company or for people from company.



Our aim is to better focus some questions, increase the interactions and collaborations, to be able to build projects to H2020.

We will also improve the organization of training schools and at least, one training school will be organized in each last two GP.

• Mr Pablo Pelegrin (VChair) proposed to hold a large meeting with an international impact, including a large number of participants; the idea of making this meeting in Spain is a proposal to explore. Chair proposed to study the question of the partners who could finance this type of meeting – EFS, for example -.

b. Action Budget Planning

The budget may change from what have been presented because the budget increase has been done during the meeting (from 131,000.00 to 136,000.00 euros). I have duplicate and change the slide of budget with that have been definitely submitted.



c. Long-term planning (including anticipated locations and dates of future activities)

We will organise one joined meeting with the European calcium society in Toulouse in October 2017. A training school on imaging will be organised in Denmark at 19th-23th June 17. 3 WG seminars will be organized and the last meeting of the GP3 will be in Dublin in the thematic of cancer (the scientific program must be discussed with the local organizer Paul Buchanan).
